Official Transcript Reminder

Students enrolling at Seattle University for law studies are reminded that the Law School must have on file for each student an official, final undergraduate transcript, showing the award of a Bachelor's Degree. The copy included with the LSDAS report does not meet this requirement. If you have not already done so, please arrange to

have your official transcript mailed to the Office of Admission.

College Cost Reduction and Access Act

The act puts an annual limit on loan payments for borrowers with high educational debt compared to income level and helps borrowers who are employed in public service make affordable monthly payments over a period of 10 years.
