

Kelly Jo MacArthur has served as senior executive of several technology companies known for launching groundbreaking technologies. In 2007, MacArthur served as Vice President and Interim General Counsel of Linden Research, Inc. (Linden Lab), based in San Francisco, the creator of the revolutionary virtual world Second Life. From 1996 to 2007, MacArthur served as a senior executive at RealNetworks, Inc., which introduced streaming media to the Internet. She served as Senior Vice President, General Counsel and Corporate Secretary from 1996 to 2003 and as Chief of Staff from 2003 through 2006, serving also as interim head of Human Resources, and Public Relations and Corporate Communications. She also served as the General Counsel of MusicNet, Inc., the first legal Internet music business, a joint venture between RealNetworks, AOL and three major record labels. MacArthur served as General Counsel and head of Legal and Business Affairs from 1995 to 1996 for The Tribune Company subsidiary, Compton's NewMedia, Inc., one of the early leading multimedia CD-ROM creators and industry innovators. She started her legal career as an attorney at Sidley Austin Brown and Wood in Chicago, Illinois in 1989.

Ms. MacArthur holds a Juris Doctorate degree from Harvard Law School and a B.A. in English from University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign. She has taught at University of Washington Law School, Columbia College, and University of Illinois- Springfield. She has served on the boards of the Digital Media Association (DiMA), the Software Information Industry Association (SIIA), the Washington Technology Industry Association (WTIA), the RealNetworks Foundation and several other non-profit and public service boards.

She works today as an advisor to several companies in the technology, media and arts industries, including software, consumer subscription businesses, social networking, traditional media and arts organizations, and non-profit management.
