WORKING WITH THE KHMER ROUGE TRIBUNAL
Documentation Center of Cambodia - Phnom Penh, Cambodia

THE DOCUMENTATION CENTER OF CAMBODIA (DC-Cam) seeks several exceptional law students to serve as Summer Legal Associates in 2008 and conduct work related to the Extraordinary Chambers in the Courts of Cambodia (ECCC), set up in 2006 to try senior leaders of the Khmer Rouge. DC-Cam is an independent Cambodian NGO originally created by Yale University scholars pursuant to the Cambodian Genocide Justice Act of 1994. It is dedicated to ensuring *memory* and *justice* in Cambodia with respect to the abuses of the infamous Democratic Kampuchea (DK) regime. The Center documents the history of Democratic Kampuchea and promotes accountability and the rule of law, holding the world's largest body of information and potential evidence against former DK officials.

THE KHMER ROUGE TRIBUNAL is putting certain former DK officials on trial, and DC-Cam is playing a central role in the proceedings. Through its Tribunal Response Team, the Center assists ECCC staff and defense attorneys in their investigations. DC-Cam also has a Victim Participation Team that informs survivors about their right to participate in Court proceedings. Summer Associates will have important roles to play in these and other projects by carrying out the following duties:

- Summer Associates will be responsible for daily monitoring of and reporting on proceedings in the Extraordinary Chambers and drafting daily trial reports, which will be distributed through daily “blogs,” listservs, and print newsletters.
- Summer Associates will prepare educational materials for translation as part of DC-Cam's outreach to Cambodian society in Phnom Penh and beyond. Some of these may be selected for publication in the Center's magazine, *Searching for the Truth*.
- Summer Associates will serve as Research Assistants to the Director, Deputy Director, and International Legal Advisors. In particular, they will assist DC-Cam's International Legal Advisors in the development of independent legal commentaries.
